

Code of ethics of scientific publications

The editorial board of the of the journal Problems of Atomic Science and Technology, ser. Thermonuclear Fusion adheres to the principles of editorial ethics established in the international community that are reproduced in the Code of ethics for scientific publications developed by the Committee on the ethics of scientific publications.

Ethic principles in the editorial staff activity

In its activity the editorial staff is guided by the following basic principles:

- At the decision making on the paper publication the journal editorial board is guided by the reliability of the presented data and scientific significance of the work under consideration.
- The editorial board evaluates intellectual contents of typescripts regardless of the race, sex, sexual orientation, religious views, social origin or political preferences of the authors.
- Unpublished data derived from the typescripts submitted to consideration should not be used for personal purposes or communicated to the third parties without written consent of the communicating author. Information or ideas derived in the course of editing and connected with possible privileges should remain confidential and not be used for the purpose of self-profit receipt.
- The editorial board does not permit publication of the information, concerning which it has sufficient reason to believe that it is plagiarism.
- The editor should not leave complaints concerning examined typescripts or published materials without response. At the deflection of a conflict situation hr should take all the necessary measures for restoration of infringed rights.

Ethic principles in the reviewers activity

Reviewer makes a scientific examination of author's typescript, therefore his actions should have open-minded approach based in the implementation of the following principles:

- The typescript received for reviewing should be considered as a confidential document, which cannot be given for acquaintance or discussion to the third parties, who has no corresponding permission from the editorial staff.
- The reviewer must give an objective and well-reasoned appraisal of the set forth results of studies. Personal criticism of an author is unacceptable.
- Unpublished data derived from the typescripts submitted to consideration should not be used by a reviewer for personal purposes.

— The reviewer, who does not possess (in his judgment) sufficient skill for the typescript appraisal or cannot be objective, e.g. in case of conflict of interests with an author or his institution, should report the corresponding information to the editor with request to exclude him from the reviewers of the typescript.

Ethic principles that should be used as guidance by authors of scientific publications

An author or composite author is aware of responsibility for the novelty and reliability of scientific study results, what presupposes compliance with the following principles:

- The authors must give true results of studies described in their typescripts. Deliberately erroneous and adulterated statements are unacceptable.
- The authors should guarantee that the study results stated in the submitted typescript are fully original. The fragments and statements taken from other publications should be formalized with mandatory indication of the authors and original source. Excessive adoption and plagiarism in any forms, including not properly executed quotations, paraphrasing or misappropriation of rights to results of somebody else's studies are unethical and unacceptable.
- It is necessary to acknowledge contribution of all the persons, who somehow or other had an influence on the course of studies, in particular references to the works, which were of significance at the study carrying out, should be given in the typescript.
- The authors should not submit to the journal a typescript, which was sent to another journal and is there under consideration, or the paper published in another journal.
- All the persons, who contributed appreciably to the study carrying out, should be indicated as co-authors. Inclusion of persons, who did not take part in the studies, into the list of co-authors is unacceptable.
- If an author finds out essential mistakes or inaccuracies in the typescript during its consideration or after its publication, he should inform the journal editorial staff as soon as possible.
